Roger E. Combs graduated from the University of Missouri-Columbia and began his military career by attending Officer Candidate School in the United States Marine Corps in 1968. After designation as a naval aviator, he served a tour in Viet Nam as a combat helicopter pilot in 1969–1970. Although he does not hold a United States Air Force rating, he is an aircraft commander who has earned ratings as a Naval Aviator and is a Senior Army Aviator.

By 1975 he received his Juris Doctorate Degree from the University of Missouri. He has over 2,500 flying hours in four types of rotary wing aircraft including more than 500 hours of combat time in a CH-46. He also served as Chief Aircraft Maintenance Officer at the Marine Corps Air Station in Quantico, Aircraft Commander with the Missouri Army National Guard, and for a number of years as Director of Intelligence for a C-130 Airlift Wing with the Missouri Air National Guard. His last assignment was as

Director of Strategic Plans and Policy for the National Guard Bureau, Arlington, Virginia. He is currently a member of the Air Reserve Forces Policy Committee and is a Retired Major General in the Air National Guard.
