Margaret 'Margie' Falco Jacob enlisted in the United States Women's Army Corp in 1950. After basic training at Ft. Lee, VA, she was assigned to clerk-typist school at Ft. Dix, NJ before being assigned to the St. Louis Finance Center.



For her service, Margie received the Good Conduct Medal and Korean War Ribbon. She was honorably discharged in 1953.

Margie fondly recalls being sent to train at Ft. Slocomb, NY with all branches of the military, male and female, officer and enlisted, together in classes for specialized training in education, information and orientation. The best advice is her own, "Don't be afraid to ask questions".

In civilian life, Margie remained in St. Louis working at a library and then as a payroll clerk for a local furniture store. Margie and her husband Forrest were married for 57 years before he passed. They had three children, five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. She is a member of the American Legion and an Honor Flight volunteer. She currently volunteers in her local school district with the History Alive program, sharing her military story.
