Michael Butcher enlisted in the United States Army in October 1967. After completing basic training at Ft. Polk, LA, Michael was assigned to flight school at Ft. Wolters, TX. He became a warrant officer first class after graduation in February 1969, a commissioned officer in 1970 and company commander of an armored unit in 1974. He was frequently on temporary duty assignments at the Pentagon and worked in partnership with the Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff of Intelligence.

For his service, Michael was awarded several medals including Bronze Star with Oak Leaf Cluster, Distinguished Service Medal, Expert Marksmanship Badge, Viet Nam Campaign Medal and National Defense Service Medal. He was honorably discharged in 1980.

In civilian life, Michael worked with the Defense Intelligence Agency assigned to the Intelligence Threat Analysis Center near Arlington, VA. He eventually returned home to Missouri and recently retired as a field supervisor from a local veteran-owned business. He enjoys competitive bass and trout fishing, volunteering with Kids Fishing Day at Roaring River State Park, and visiting with his two daughters and their families.
