Mary Jantosik entered the United States Marine Corps in 1952, attending basic training at Paris Island, NC and additional training at Camp Lejeune, NC. She was assigned to Quantico, VA as a secretary. She received the Good Conduct Medal and was honorably discharged in 1955.

Two of Mary's most memorable experiences were when she participated in the 1953 Armistice Day parade in New York and when she served in the Honor Guard in Richmond, VA for Eleanor Roosevelt's speech before the United Nations.

Since her time on active duty, Mary has continued her service to our country through many volunteer activities. She served 10 years in the Military Funeral Honors and has acted as hostess at the VA Hospital at Jefferson Barracks.
