Doyle E, Sappington enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in 1980, traveling to over 40 countries and participating in conflicts around the world, including the invasions of Grenada and the bombing of Beirut, Lebanon in 1983. Following his honorable discharge in 1991, he served with the Missouri Army National Guard from 1991-2004, participating in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

During his 20 year career, Doyle was awarded numerous medals, awards and citations including Presidential Unit Citation, Valorous Unit Award, Combat Action Badge, National Defense Service Medal, War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal and others.

In civilian life, Doyle worked as the community corrections service manager with the Department of Justice, Bureau of Prisons. For the past 13 years he has served as a federal police sergeant with the Department of Veterans Affairs. He lives in southern Missouri with his wife Le' and their service animal, Sophie Kathryn.
