Lucas Remington Landolt

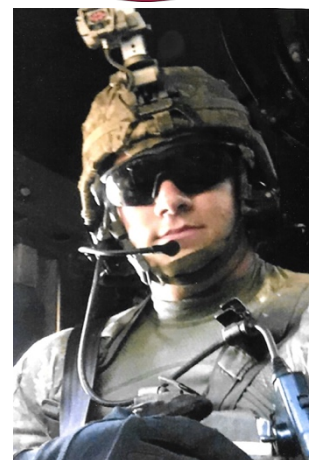

Lucas R. Landolt enlisted in the United States Army in St. Louis, MO on January 13, 2015. He began Basic Training at Fort Benning, GA assigned to the 19 Delta Cavalry unit. He then entered Airborne School where he earned his jump wings, requiring completion of five successful jumps; three daytime jumps and two at night while carrying a 50 lb. Ruck Sack on his back. His graduation from Airborne School prepared him for service in the 1st Squadron, 73rd Cavalry Regiment of the 2nd Brigade Combat Team in the 82nd Airborne Division. During his service in the 1st Squadron 73rd Cavalry, 2nd Brigade, he completed twenty-two successful jumps.

On January 4, 2017, he left for Mosul, Iraq for service in Operative Inherent Resolve. His responsibilities included assisting the US Army and the US Air Force (alongside Iraqi forces) in planning tactics against ISIS forces. He worked closely with Brigade Commander, General Pat Work, planning and implementing Drone attacks against the enemy.



In October 2017, Lucas returned to Fort Brag, NC for an honorable discharge. He then enlisted in the Army National Guard at Jefferson Barracks in St. Louis, MO, serving in the 1138th Transportation Company as a military truck driver. Most recently transporting much needed supplies during the Pandemic.

Lucas plans to re-enlist in the 74 Delta, Army National Guard, serving as a CBRN specialist. The CBRN detects and responds against chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear weapons of mass destruction.

During his service he has been awarded many medals and ribbons commemorating his service.

One event that left a lasting memory was how different living in the Middle East is from the United States. Another vivid memory is the fact that he did not know what might be awaiting him on the ground as he landed from your jump out of a plane (with a 50 lb. Ruck Sack along with a gun and ammunition).

The best piece of advice received by Lucas "The task ahead of you is never as great as the power behind you." To Lucas that meant that there is nothing you can't overcome if you believe in yourself.

Lucas is employed by the Boeing Company as an F18 Fighter Jet assembly mechanic.

Lucas serves as a volunteer with Sheep Dog Impact Assistance (SDIA). SDIA exists to engage, assist, and empower the men and women serving in our nation's military, law enforcement, fire & rescue and EMS services – a community of people we call "Sheep Dogs." In addition, he is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.
