Grant volunteered for the Army in Springfield, Missouri when he was 30 years old and did his basic training at Fort Leonard Wood Missouri. He served two tours of duty in Iraq for “Operation Iraqi Freedom” with each tour lasting a year. His first tour was in 2003 with the 12th Bravo Engineers where they looked for roadside bombs. His second tour in 2008-2009 was more of a policing tour. He served in the Army Reserve for 24 years and retired in 2018.



Grant received several medals and citations during his service to his country. He said he would enlist again in a heartbeat as it was an honor to serve with the men in his unit and he said he had a great first sergeant.

He is married to wife Darla, and they have 5 daughters and 3 sons who he described as awesome kids. Two of his sons are currently serving in the military. One son joined the Marines for 4 years and then joined the Army. His son Chris is currently serving in the Army Old Guard and is part of the Firing Party who hold the sacred duty of rendering the final honors to military veterans through the precision of a 21-gun salute at Arlington National Cemetery.
