Honorable military service runs in T.J. Vogelweid's family.

Dr. Vogelweid, of Moberly, Missouri, served our country from January, 1941, to September, 1945, in the Army's 19th Tank Battalion. He served in England, France, Luxembourg, Belgium, and Germany. His unit was at the Battle of the Bulge and the Battle of Germany. He was also in the Horse Cavalry and rode 900 miles on one maneuver. He received many awards and citations; among them, a Purple Heart and a Presidential Unit Citation.

After his service, he entered the University of Missouri and graduated in 1951 with a degree in Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Vogelweid isn't just an ordinary vet, he even makes house calls. He has been a valuable asset to the Moberly community. He is a member of the VFW and DAV.



He and his wife, Dorothy, of 54 years, have three children, Gary, David, and Susan, and one grandchild, Eric.
