His service and duty locations included: basic training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina; Food Service Specialist School and Logistics Specialist School in Fort Lee, Virginia; Military Police School, Missouri National Guard Headquarters-Public Affairs School at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. Other duty stations included: Coleman Barracks, Manheim Germany; Naval Air Station, Corpus Christi, Texas; Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Camp Ashland, Nebraska; Camp Clark, Missouri.
