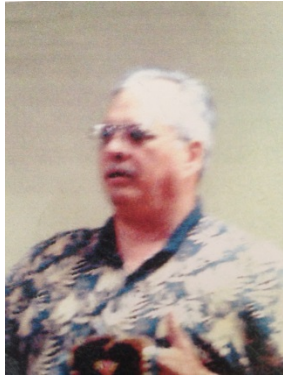

Bob served in the Army as a Captain. His service years were from August 1978 until August 2000. He was in the Field Artillery and Chemical Regiment in Ft. Sill, Oklahoma; Ft. McClellan, Alabama; JRTC, MTC, and Ft. Wayne Wright, Alaska. His awards and citations include: Army Service Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (6), Army Achievement Medal, and the Armed Forces Reserve Medal (2), MO-LSR (20 yr), Sharp Shooter Rifle, Expert Grenade, Sharp Shooter Pistol Basic Training Service Ribbon, and the Non-Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon (2).

He is married with four children, 14 grandchildren, and one great-grandchild. He has worked as a Corrections Officer II – Segregation Supervisor / part time Deputy Sheriff. He belongs to the National Native American Veterans Association, Quapaw Inter-Tribal Gourd Society, Field Artillery Association, and the Pawhuska In-Lon-Schka District Osage Nation.

Robert and his wife presented a program to the Marshall Chapter, NSDAR in October 2012. He spoke about his Native American ancestry. He brought clothing that the Native American Indians wear to their tribal meetings and described the designs and making of the clothing. His presentation was very interesting and informative.
