Lee Roy Fowler was born July 29, 1923 on Camp Creek, Brunot, Missouri. After attending grammar school at Woods, Des Arc and Camp Creek, he attended Patterson High School in Patterson, Missouri. He moved to St. Louis, Missouri, working until being drafted into military service on February 2, 1943. After basic training in Salt Lake City, Utah, he was trained as a medic at Fort Benjamin-Harrison, Indiana, and then transferred to Lincoln, Nebraska. He was transferred to Sacramento, California in 1945 and was slated for deployment to the Pacific theater just a few weeks before World War II ended. He was then transferred to St. Joseph, Missouri, and later discharged as a corporal at Jefferson Barracks Army Base, St. Louis, Missouri on February 6, 1946. He received a Good Conduct Medal during his service.

Lee Roy is a past commander of the Piedmont American Legion Post 281 in Piedmont, Missouri. He is a member of the Masonic/Wayne Lodge #526, and he has been a member of the United Methodist Church for over 45 years. Lee Roy was an avid horseman and charter member of the Wayne County Saddle Club. Lee Roy is married and has one son, two step-sons, one step-daughter, and eleven grandchildren.
