Jack Crouch served as a Corporal in the U.S. Marine Corps. He entered the service in San Diego, California, in March 1952. His service job was aviation ordinance. His duty locations included Jacksonville, Florida, and El Toro, California, and Oahu, Hawaii. He received the Good Conduct Medal, Sharp Shooter Badge, and Korean Service Medal. He was discharged in March of 1955 in San Francisco, California.

Jack returned home to Sugar Creek, Missouri, in March 1955. He married in August and went to Tulsa, Oklahoma, to attend Spartan College of Spartan College of Aeronautics and Technology for the next two years, using the G.I. Bill. In 1957, he started his career with Continental Airlines in El Paso, Texas. His worked as an aircraft mechanic and maintenance supervisor. Jack has earned both a Bachelor of Arts and Master's Degree.

Jack has served as an adult volunteer with the Boy Scouts of America. He has volunteered on his Neighborhood Watch Committee for many years. In addition, he has served as director of the airline club to which he belongs.
