George Roy Stuber was born in rural Buchanan County on April 13, 1926, to Alfred and Minnie Stuber. George had six brothers and sisters.

George joined the Navy in Kansas City, Missouri, in February 1946. His basic training was in San Diego. In May of 1946 he was transferred to Guam. He was aboard the USS Blue and patrolled waters off of China's coast, the Philippines, and Pearl Harbor. He was a fireman first class where he worked in maintenance to keep the ship running. George was discharged in December of 1947 in San Diego. He received the World War II Victory Medal, the American Campaign Service Medal, and the Asian Pacific Campaign Medal.

George was married to his loving wife, Gwen, for 46 years. Sadly, Gwen died unexpectedly in 1992. George and Gwen bought a farm north of the farm where George was raised. The farm in Andrew County is still in operation with the help of George's son-in-law. George has a son and a daughter, along with six grandchildren, and 11 great grandchildren.

He is an active member of the Hope United Church of Christ serving the church in many capacities.

He also served on the board of the Avenue City School District and coached local softball teams. He has been a member of the Cosby Masonic Blue Lodge for over 50 years, the Scottish Rite, and Moila Temple.
