As a Communications Center Specialist 4, she decoded messages. Transferring to Fort Ritchie, Maryland she worked in the communications station. She was transferred to Primeas, Germany where she served for 13 months. Linda was discharged in 1964.

Linda is in charge of Meals for Comfort which serve meals for all funerals at her church. She is area Captain for the National Take Off Pounds Sensible (TOPS) organization where she supervises 26 local chapters.
