Norman Patrick graduated from high school and enlisted in the United States Navy in January 1952 at St. Louis, Missouri. He went to boot camp at Great Lakes, Illinois, and was then transferred to the Amphibious Base at Coronado, California. He was then transferred to the Philippine Islands, landing in Manila, then on to the naval base at Subic Bay, Philippines.

While in the Navy, he was a diesel mechanic, then became a storekeeper and saw twenty months of foreign and sea duty. Norman was discharged in December 1955 as a Storekeeper Seaman. After his discharge, he went inactive United States Naval Reserve for four years. He received the National Defense Medal, Good Conduct Medal and the Korean Defense Medal.

Norman was married to Mary Jean Foster and they have one daughter, three grandchildren and one great-grandson. His working career consisted of working at the Wabash Railroad, being a Registered Representative for Metropolitan Life Insurance, and then becoming an independent agent selling all lines of insurance.

Norman is a member of the Baptist Church, member of the American Legion, a 50 year member of the Masonic Lodge, a 50 year member of the Kansas City Ararat Shrine and Gideons. He went on the Honor Flight to Washington, D.C. in 2015.
