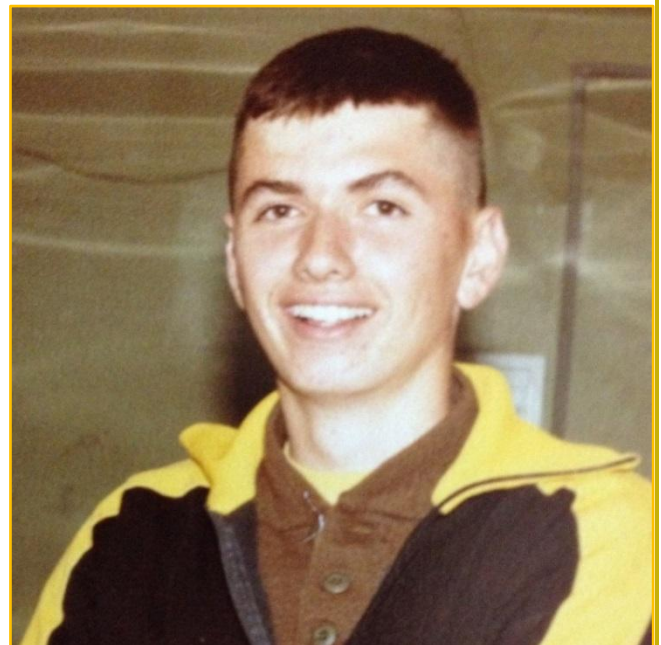

Joseph enlisted in the United States Army in July, 1983. He went to basic training at Fort Still, Oklahoma. His Advanced Individual Training was completed at Fort Jackson, South Carolina.

In January, 1984, Joseph began serving in the 212th Military Police (MP) Company, Leighton, Barracks, Wurzburg, Germany, where he served as an Administrative Specialist. He loved serving the MP's as their military clerk. He took considerable joy in receiving packages for them at odd times because it was so encouraging to them and a lifeline to home back in the United States. He served in this location through May, 1986. Joseph moved to Missouri, and served in the United States Army Reserve from May, 1986, to May, 1989.
