<b>BAA</b>	Build An App (BAA) – shortcut to creating an application accessed through the GRS Ancestor or Member database. <b>BC</b>	Birth Certificate
<b>BOM or NBOM or NBM</b>	National Board of Management Meeting (when NN's are assigned) BOM can also signify State Board of Management; the NBOM meets on or about the 5 <sup>th</sup> of each month

<b>Cameo Society</b>	A club within a State Society for the fellowship of ladies who share a common bond of DAR membership with mothers, daughters, and granddaughters.
<b>C.A.R.</b>	National Society Children of the American Revolution (include periods in acronym) – co-ed patriotic youth organization for children up to 21 years of age. <a href="https://www.nscar.org/">https://www.nscar.org/</a>
<b>CDR or CDRC</b>	Chapter Development and Revitalization Commission (CDR or CDRC) – committee designed to assist chapters to attract new members, retain current membership, and revitalize struggling chapters. <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/member-resources/commission/chapter-development-and-revitalization/commission">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/member-resources/commission/chapter-development-and-revitalization/commission</a>
<b>CL</b>	Continental Line (CL) – the Continental Army was the army of the United Colonies representing the Thirteen Colonies and later the United States; the first Continental Line served in PA as part of the Continental Army.

<b>CS</b>	Civil Service (CS) – activities that supported the formation of the new patriotic government but were not military in nature (e.g., Selectman, Moderator, or Justice of the Peace).

<b>DOB</b>	Date of Birth (DOB)
<b>DOC</b>	Daughters Online Community (DOC) – a secure, DAR-only website where active Daughters may interact with one another and share resources and ideas—similar to the Facebook groups. Must use your eMembership sign-in or request a password. <b>Docs</b>	Documents submitted with applications.
<b>DOD</b>	Date of Death (DOD)
<b>DR</b>	Death Record (DR) – record other than a government issued DC.

<b>Genie</b>	Genealogists at National who verify lineage on applications and supplementals.

<b>HW</b>	Have Written (HW) – letter from the verifying genealogist (genie) requesting more information on an application or supplemental. <b>IA</b>	Image Access (IA) – all Chapter Registrars are granted IA on eMembership; used for researching DAR applications and preparing PM apps.
<b>Inheritance Project</b>	Inheritance Project – allows members to claim for a one-time fee all verified Patriots as Inherited Patriots whom their mother and/or grandmother established through an approved App or Supp.
<b>Insignia</b>	Insignia Committee is concerned with the proper use of the DAR Insignia, including the appropriate manner and circumstances for wearing DAR Insignia pins, the official ribbon, and sashes. The DAR Insignia is the official symbol of the National Society in the form of a spinning wheel and distaff. <b>JAC</b>	Junior American Citizens (JAC) – promotes civics education, American heritage and history, love of country and service. <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/service-committees/junior-american-citizens/committee-home">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/service-committees/junior-american-citizens/committee-home</a>
<b>Juniors</b>	Junior Members are between 18 years of age and 35 years of age, holding full DAR membership. This young group of DAR members holds their own fundraisers, grants scholarships, and may serve as Pages at official DAR meetings. <b>Lantern Chapter</b>	Recognition for a chapter based on one of the following criteria: chapter that transfers an organizing regent, transfers five or more members to organize a new chapter, or transfers five or more members to revitalize a chapter. <b>Legacy</b>	Legacy Program – a program to encourage prospective members (PM) to take the easiest pathway to membership; there is a pin available when a member's app is linked to a family member's app or supp in the 2nd or 3rd generation. <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/service-committees/membership/membership-programs">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/service-committees/membership/membership-programs</a>
<b>Life Member</b>	Earned by a member who completes a Life Membership application and submits a contribution. <b>Life Member-Pending</b>	Classification of a member younger than the age of 65 who has completed the Life Member Application process.
<b>Loyalists</b>	Those loyal to the British Crown ("Loyalists" or "Tories") during the American Revolution.
<b>LR or LRC</b>	Lineage Research Committee (LR or LRC) – provides specific lineage documentation support for prospective member (PM) applications. <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/genealogy-committees/lineage-research/lineage-research-committee-mission">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/genealogy-committees/lineage-research/lineage-research-committee-mission</a>
<b>M4M</b>	Member-for-Member (M4M) – celebrates DAR members who recruit new members to join DAR. <b>MC, MR</b>	Marriage Certificate (MC) or Marriage Record (MR)
<b>Mem #</b>	Member Number (See <i>NN</i> or <i>National Number</i> )
<b>MTF</b>	Membership Task Force (MTF) – a volunteer network across the country whose goal is to help chapters with difficult applications. <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/special-committees/membership-task-force">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/special-committees/membership-task-force</a>
<b>NIP</b>	National Information Packet (NIP) – contains information about each DAR Committee with its mission and goals for that year (updated annually). <b>NN</b>	National Number (NN) – a member's unique membership number, assigned sequentially since the founding of NSDAR. NN are assigned monthly at the BOM meeting on or about the 5 <sup>th</sup> of each month.
<b>Official Ribbon</b>	Where a member places her purchased pins demonstrating her service, contributions, and patriot ancestors. Ribbons may be ordered in varying lengths and widths from 1 to 5 columns wide and 4" to 14" long ( <a href="https://shop.dar.org/ribbon/">https://shop.dar.org/ribbon/</a> ). <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/insignia-resources">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/insignia-resources</a>
<b>OJ</b>	Outstanding Junior (OJ) – annual recognition of Junior members of the NSDAR who have promoted the aims and purposes of the National Society. <a href="https://www.dar.org/members/committees/service-committees/junior-membership/junior-member-committee-home">https://www.dar.org/members/committees/service-committees/junior-membership/junior-member-committee-home</a>
<b>Pages</b>	DAR Members 40 years of age or under, who serve as hostesses, errand-runners, personal assistants, and flag-bearers at state events and Continental Congress. Paging opportunities are also open to C.A.R. members 12 and older. <b>Pathway of Patriots</b>	DAR Pathway of the Patriots – a project to honor the 250th anniversary of the USA by planting 250 trees and adopting them in memory of Revolutionary War Patriots. <a href="https://www.dar.org/national-society/america-250/dar-pathway-patriots">https://www.dar.org/national-society/america-250/dar-pathway-patriots</a>
<b>Patriot</b>	Those who demanded that the British Parliament honor the rights granted to the colonies by charter; in DAR terms, these are Patriotic Ancestors.



<b>Pins</b>	<p>Pins represent the service, contributions, and patriotic ancestors of a member. Each member may order the pins which they have earned, along with a corresponding ribbon. DAR Insignia and Pins may be worn only at functions of the National Society, state organizations, or chapters, or when representing the organization. <b>PM</b>	Prospective Member (PM) – a candidate for membership in NSDAR.
<b>PS</b>	Patriotic Service (PS) – activities that supported the overall war effort, but that were not military in nature (e.g., furnishing supplies to the army, paying supply taxes to support the war effort, or signing an Oath of Allegiance).
<b>Record Copy</b>	<p>Record Copy – a copy of a previously verified DAR membership and supplemental applications and the available supporting documents retained by the National Society. <b>R.E.D. Friday</b>	<p>Remember Everyone Deployed (R.E.D.) Friday was created to remind people of our heroes overseas and show that we are thinking of them. <b>Registrar</b>	A chapter officer position who liaisons between the Office of the Registrar General, the State Registrar, and the applicant (PM).
<b>Ribbon</b>	See <i>Official Ribbon</i> and <i>Right Side Ribbon</i> .
<b>Right Side Ribbon</b>	DAR Right Side Ribbons are worn on a member's right shoulder and may display non-official pins; official pins are worn on the left on an official blue and white ribbon (see <i>Official Ribbon</i> ). Right Side Ribbons may be purchased on etsy, eBay, or other third-party sites.

<b>SAR</b>	<p>National Society Sons of the American Revolution (SAR)</p> <p><a href="https://www.sar.org/">https://www.sar.org/</a></p>
<b>Sash</b>	<p>Worn by members in leadership positions; sash widths of blue and white fabric designate the leadership level: 5" for PG, 3.5" for Executive Officers, 2.5" for VPG, and 1.25" for State Regent.</p> <p><a href="https://shop.dar.org/dar-insignia-store/ribbons/">https://shop.dar.org/dar-insignia-store/ribbons/</a></p>
<b>SAT</b>	State Application Taskforce (SAT) – replaced by the Membership Task Force
