Honoring Those Recipients of America's Oldest Military Award



The Purple Heart Medal is the oldest and one of the most recognized and respected medals awarded to those who have been wounded or killed in combat. It is also the first award bestowed upon the common enlisted soldier. Established by General George Washington on August 7, 1782, the "Badge of Military Merit" made of purple cloth in the shape of a heart, recognized common soldiers for their valor at a time when fighting the campaign was tough, morale and pay was low, and supplies were scarce. After the American Revolutionary War, the award was ignored for nearly 150 years until it was re-introduced as the Purple Heart Medal on February 22, 1932, the 200th anniversary of George Washington's birth.

The medal's plain inscription "FOR MILITARY MERIT" barely expresses its significance.

During the Parks Administration, we will be honoring the service and sacrifice of those men and women who have been wounded or killed in action, known to us as "Purple Heart Patriots." Without them, this nation would not be free and millions of people from around the world would not have the ability to live in freedom.

Similar to the "Patriot of the Month" program, the "Purple Heart Patriots" program will focus on the individual for their heroic actions for which they were awarded the Purple Heart Medal. Their stories, told in their own words or the words of a family member, will be published monthly on the MSSDAR public website. We are planning to honor our Purple Heart Patriots and Gold Star family members with a ceremony in August 2025. More information will be provided at a later date.

How to submit an individual to be honored as a "Purple Heart Patriot"

Your chapter is invited to participate in this new program by interviewing a veteran, service member, or a family member of a deceased service member. We want to hear their stories in their own words.

Here are some questions you may consider asking. Be observant of how the interview is going and that the interviewee is comfortable in answering the questions you're asking. All questions are optional. If needed, change the dialog to a more positive one to make the interviewee feel more at ease. Above all, take the time to listen to their stories.

Questions for Active Duty Military or Veteran

- ♥Which branch of service did you serve in?
- ♥Where were you stationed and what unit were you with when you were wounded?
- ♥Describe the day and the events leading up to the time you were wounded.
- ♥Where were you evacuated to for medical treatment?
- ♥Would you like to share your experiences while you were recovering?
- ♥Describe how you were presented with your Purple Heart award.

♥Describe how you were told of
death and what were you told about his
heroic sacrifice.
♥Describe how you were presented with

Questions for a Gold Star Family Member

Before you leave the interview, ask for a photo of the "Purple Heart Patriot," they would like to share while in the service and ask to take one of them with their Purple Heart Medal. If deceased, ask the family member for a photo they would like to share of the Patriot being honored and possibly a photo of the family member with the Purple Heart Medal.
