Stanton Garr, US Army (1942-1946)

Stanton Garr served in the Army's 342nd Ordinance Regiment from January 1942 to November 1946. He served in England, France, Germany, Belgium, and Holland.

He returned home to Keytesville, MO and farmed with his father and his brother, Pete. In 1950, he married Clara Asbury. They had three children. He and Clara have continued to farm and raise cattle.

Stanton has been a member of the Grange for over 50 years. He served that organization as State Master for 10 years, and then served as Treasurer. He helped organize the Chariton County Soil and Water District, served on the County Extension Council, and was chairman of the County Beef Association. He also helped organize the Rothville Cemetery Association, served as its president for eight years, and then continued on the board for several years. He and Clara have been members of the Rothville Baptist Church since their marriage in 1950.

The couple have three grandsons, a granddaughter, and one great-grandson. He and son, Stanton Lee, continue to raise cattle in partnership. He commented that his main job is Clara's handyman.
