Harold Arensmeier entered the U.S. Army on October 1, 1943. After basic training he went to Camp Fannin, Tyler, Texas, for Infantryman training. He was then assigned to Camp Stoneman, California, where he was processed out for overseas duty. In Hawaii, Harold received three months of jungle and amphibious training. As a part of the 1st Campaign Guam, he was in the Battles of Leyte, Philippines, Ryukyu Islands, Okinawa and le Shima Airfield, Okinawa.

Harold was wounded in battle on Okinawa and flown to Guam for treatment. He was transferred to Honolulu, Hawaii, then on to California, and finally to Fitzsimons Army Medical Center, Aurora, Colorado. He was discharged from the service after serving two years and six days, on October 6, 1945. He was in and out of the service before he was twenty-one.
