Paul Marvin Borden was born November 24, 1939 in Kansas City, MO. He attended Central High School and graduated in 1957. In the summer of 1959 Paul joined the Air Force. He attended boot camp in San Antonio, TX. He was stationed in South Carolina, Louisiana, and Missouri as an Airman Second Class assigned to the 442nd Troop Carrier Wing. He was trained as a mechanic for the C-124 Globemaster cargo aircraft. Paul was honorably discharged in 1964.

After his service in the Air Force, Paul worked at Black and Veatch in Kansas City as a printer from 1962 until 1967. For the next five years he managed Macy's printing shop. He became a firefighter in 1970 and worked for the Independence Fire Department for 25 years. Recently the Independence Chapter Sons of the American Revolution honored Paul for his service to the community as a firefighter.

Paul married Wanda Freeman in 1963. They have three sons, Nathaniel, Charles, and Tom. They have five grandchildren of which two are members of the Children of the American Revolution. They have one daughter-in-law that is a member of the DAR. Paul is a deacon at the Summit Assembly Church and works part-time at a car dealership as a driver.
