William (Bill) Burnham enlisted in the United States Army in 1966 during the Vietnam War. He completed his basic training at Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri. Bill was assigned to Military Police School at Ft. Gordon, Georgia. He spent most of his tour in Miesau, Germany working in security for nuclear weapons. He earned qualified expert with the M-14 rifle and .45 caliber pistol. Bill received a letter of appreciation form the 164th Military Police Company. He was honorably discharged in 1969 with the rank of Sergeant.
