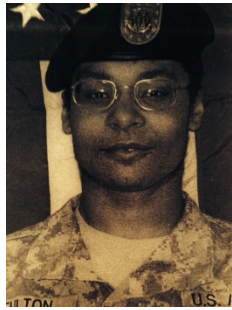

Sheila Fulton enlisted in the Army on 29 December 2005. She was trained as a 63B Light Wheel Vehicle Mechanic where she worked on diesel vehicles from bumper to bumper. After her training she served two tours in Iraq: 14 months from February 2007 to April 2008 and 11 months from August 2009 to July 2010. In Iraq she went out on night patrols where part of her duties were to search the females they encountered. In 2009 she was reclassified as a 91B, All Wheel Vehicle Mechanic working on light diesel vehicles to small tanks. Sheila re-enlisted in Iraq in 2009 to switch her MOS to 15D Aircraft Powertrain Repairer, thereby extending her original contract with the United States Army. After Iraq, Sheila returned to Fort Riley, Kansas where she met her husband. She was then sent to Fort Eustis, Virginia for training as a 15D. Once training was complete her next assignment was at Camp Humphrey, Korea, 602nd Aviation Support Battalion. She was in Korea for 19 months. After Korea, in 2011, Sheila headed off to join the 82nd Aviation Combat Brigade at Fort Bragg where she remained until separation from the Army in 2014. But Sheila was not done with the military; she later joined the Army Reserve unit, 479th Engineering Platoon as 12N Horizontal Construction Engineer (Heavy Equipment Operator), where she waits for her retraining.

During her service Sheila received Combat Spurs, three Army Commendation Medals, one Valorous Unit Citation, two Good Conduct Medals, two Overseas Ribbons, one Global War on Terrorism, one National Defense Service Ribbon, the Iraq Campaign Medal, one Korea Defense Medal, numerous certificates of achievement and aviation wings.
