Judy L. Adams, joined the United States Army in 1963. Following graduation from Sioux Valley Hospital School of Nursing in Sioux Falls, SD, she completed basic training at Fort Sam Houston, TX in 1966 and was assigned to Madigan General Hospital in Tacoma, WA.

In September 1967, Judy left for Vietnam where she was stationed at the 24th Evac Hospital at Long Binh until September 1968. Following her tour in Vietnam, she was assigned to Fort Bragg, NC and promoted to Captain. Judy was honorably discharged in 1968.

As the wife of a military husband, Judy and her family moved often. A talented musician, she accompanied choirs at most of the bases where they were stationed. She also served as a Cub Scout den mother, accompanied at chapels when needed, played for the Officer's Wives' Club Choir, and served in the PTA - serving as vice president for a while. Finally settling in Caruthersville, MO, Judy became musically involved with the local junior and senior high schools.

Judy is a member of her local United Methodist Church where she continued using her musical talent to direct the Chancel Choir and Bell Choir, accompany the choir and serve as the organist for 32 years. She accompanied and directed the children's choir and directed the music for bible school for many years.
