Glen enlisted in the United States Navy in June 1959, completing basic training at Naval Training Center San Diego, CA.

In 1965, Glen was assigned to a landing ship in Vietnam as petty officer in charge of engine room duties. After eight years



of sea duty, Glen served ashore as a Navy instructor before being selected for warrant officer and returning to sea duty. He returned to Vietnam in 1972, ultimately serving in eight Vietnam military campaign periods.

For his service, Glen was awarded the Navy Commendation Medal, two Meritorious Unit Citations, Good Conduct Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with five campaign stars, National Defense Medal and Armed Forces Expedition Medal. Glen was honorably discharged after 20 years of service, in October 1979.

After his retirement from Tropicana's Fort Pierce, Florida facility as utilities general supervisor, Glen returned to Missouri working as a water treatment operator. He is a member of the local American Legion post, serving on the honor guard. During his spare time, Glen also makes presentations to honor local WWII combat veterans at historical societies, schools and libraries.
