I enlisted in the Army Reserves in October, 1988 and was a member of the 21st General Hospital in St. Louis, MO until October, 1996. My job was a 75 Delta Personnel Records Specialist. There I got my licenses to drive a 5ton M939 6X6 cargo truck. It was also there that I volunteered for fire watch because of the wildfires popping up in the area. It was the first and only time I got to ride in an Army helicopter and it was at night. It was one of my more memorable experiences.

I am a multi-generation Army veteran and I have a patriot in my family from every war since the Revolutionary War up to Desert Storm. One of my favorite heirlooms is my grandfather's WWI Marine medal and certificate.
