Stephen D. Sullins is the son of William and Lilla Sullins. Stephen was raised in Boonville, Missouri graduating Boonville High School in May of 1965. In June of 1967 Stephen enlisted in the United States Marine Corps from July 1967 – June 1971. While Stephen was stationed in NAS Millington, Cherry Point NC, Okinawa, Iwakuni Japan, El Toro, CA he served as a Avionics Repairman, A6A Intruder, Search-Track Radars, Ballistic Computer, Inertial Navigation System. In December of 1974 he graduated from the University of Missouri, Columbia School of Cytotechnology and was Board certified by the American Society of Clinical Pathology in February 1975. After working for University of Missouri Columbia and Kansas City, Norther Medical Group, Independence Regional Medical Center, Upsher Laboratory and Truman Medical Center.
