# George Turley





George Bingham Turley has lived most of his life in Arrow Rock, MO. He is proud of the fact, and justly so, that his ancestors gave the land for the historic village of Arrow Rock established in 1829.

George served in the U.S. Navy from August 1969 to August 1973. He enlisted at Sedalia, MO. He received his training at Great Lakes Naval Training Center.

When asked about the best advice George received, he recalled the advice he received from his brother-in-law, "Do not come to Vietnam." George did go to Vietnam. He was a Gunner Mate on the USS Worden DLG-18, a missile frigate. The USS Worden was stationed in Yokosuka, Japan and worked the Gulf of





George received the National Defense Service Medal; Vietnam Service Medal with 1 Bronze Star; RVN Campaign Medal with Device; and the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal [Korea].
