During college, he worked as a Traffic Analyst for Lily Tulip.

His military career was in the U.S. Army's Army Security Agency where he served from October 1971 to October 1974. After completing basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, he excelled in learning Chinese

Mandarin at the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, California, mastering the language as if he had lived in the country for 15 years.
