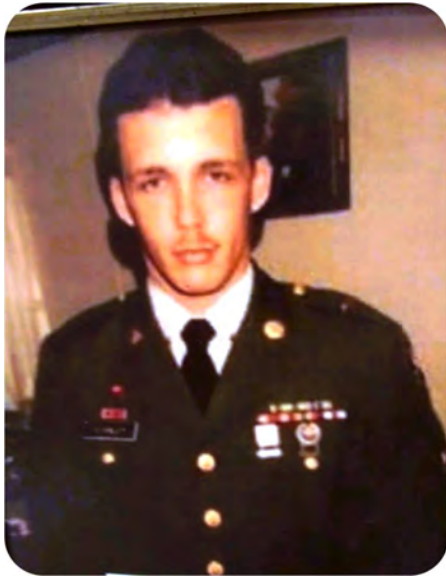

Robert Stanley attended school in Carthage, Missouri. He joined the United States Army on Veterans Day, November 11, 1982. He was trained as a construction engineer. He served at several duty stations in the states, including Fort Leonard Wood, Fort Bragg, Schofield Barracks in Hawaii, and Fort Gordon in Georgia. He served in Desert Storm, Desert Shield, and Iraqi Freedom.

While serving, he received the following awards/medals:

Commendation Medal (3), Achievement Award, Good Conduct Medal, Reserve Components Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal, Bronze Star (3), Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. Armed Forces Service Medal, Meritorious Armed Forces Reserves Medal, Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Reserve Component Overseas Ribbon, Kuwait Liberation Medal, and the Driver Mechanic Badge.

Robert retired after 23 years of service with the rank of Sergeant on March 5, 2005.

Robert has four daughters and six grandchildren. He currently serves as the Chaplain at Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post #2590 in Carthage, Missouri.
