Ginger Piatt, Honoring Her Father's Service and Sacrifice

On August 3, 1944, at the age of nineteen, Glenn Carl Edward Hutchison was born in Chillicothe, Missouri, on August 6, 1920 and lived most of his life in Brookfield Missouri. Carl had two sisters and one brother and was married on August 5, 1937.

Private First Class (PFC) Hutchison was drafted on April 14, 1944, and served the United States Army. According to his daughter, Ginger Piatt, PFC Hutchison would not talk about his time in the military, so we have limited information.

He was married with one child when he was drafted, serving in the United States Army, but unsure of his unit. He carried the Bazooka, a shoulder-fired anti-tank rocket launcher, and was wounded during a battle in Europe. He was awarded the Purple Heart

and discharged on December 6, 1945.

Carl Hutchison was a mechanic most of his life and his hobbies were fishing and gardening. He was the father of four children and passed away on February 10, 1997 in Brookfield, Missouri.
