Art Carver, Honoring His Son's Service and Sacrifice

Army Corporal Jacob Russell Carver, 20, Freeman, Missouri, died in action on Saturday, November 13, 2010, in Kandahar Province, Afghanistan. His Funeral services were held on November 23, 2010, at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church, Harrisonville. He is laid to rest in Orient Cemetery, Harrisonville.

Jacob was born April 25, 1990, in Kansas City, Missouri, the son of Arthur F. and Rosa Marie (Webster) Carver. He was a 2008 graduate of Cass-Midway High School and was a lifelong resident of Freeman, Missouri.

Jacob was assigned to Company B, 2nd Battalion, 502nd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division. He was awarded the Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart, Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal w/Bronze Service Star, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, Combat and Special Skills Badge.

Jacob was stationed at FOB (Forward Operating Base) Howz E. Madad around Kandahar, Afghanistan. Jacob was on a machine gun team, and he carried a 240-machine gun. Jacob Carroll was the other half of the team, and he carried extra ammo for the 240.

The unit was moving up highway One when they had to stop. Jacob Carver and Jacob Carroll were on point. An Afghan man was walking on the road, carrying poppy sticks on his back. He approached the unit until he was told to stop. At that point he ran at the unit and detonated a bomb he was carrying and struck the unit.

Staff Sargent Juan Rivadeneria, Corporal Jacob Russell Carver and Specialist Jacob Carroll were killed and several others were wounded.
